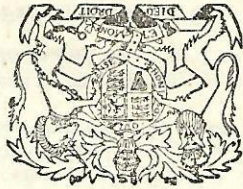

**PENSHURST**

Nearly a thousand fairy lights were lit  
at Peshurst and with the hood-  
dust of the church and of old-  
fashioned Leicester Square, transformed  
into a veritable fairy land.  
These lanterns had been erected at each  
of the three approaches to the village and  
together it was a delightful picture.  
To start the day of celebration the  
lagers and school children assembled at  
Forge, where flags and medals were  
tributed to the children, and led by the  
bridge Wells Veterans' Band, after-  
wards paraded to church, where a short  
service was conducted by the Vicar (the  
Rev. F. H. Turnbull).  
Games and competitions took place in  
Peshurst Park and tea was served to all  
the children at the Barons' Hall. The  
children also enjoyed a punch and  
judy show. In the evening the H.B.C.  
Empire broadcast was being on the lawn.  
The torchlight procession, in the charge of  
H. Chapman, took place to the bon-  
fire, where a fireworks display, in the  
charge of Mr. G. Goodwin, Mr. Mannelly  
and Mr. Izzard was also given.
